Reading of Minutes for Regular Council Meeting Minutes 05.13.2024, Special Called Meeting Minutes 05.06.2024, and Special Called Meeting Minutes 06.03.2024

Paige Bowers made the motion to adopt readings of Regular Council Meeting Minutes 05.13.2024, Special Called Meeting Minutes 05.06.2024, and Special Called Meeting Minutes 06.03.2024; seconded by Joe Moss. The vote was unanimous.

Public Session (30 Minutes Total)

Maine Dawkins-435 Wood Street approached Council about run-off issues with his home and yard. He presented Council with pictures and asked if there was something the Town could do to help with this problem when it rained really hard. He stated he loved living in Central and he has contacted the builders and he wanted Council to see the problems he was having. Council advised him we would check in with this issue.

Receipt and Disposition of Petitions (15 Minutes Total)

Phillip Mishoe reported that we have an annexation request for 307 Lawton Road. He said that it would be 100% freeholder and would be on the agenda in July.

<u>Planning – Paige Bowers</u>

Paige Bowers reported the Planning Commission would meet June 16th.

Streets and Public Safety - Joe Moss

Joe Moss thanked Chief Thompson for applying and receiving a body armor grant. He also thanked the fire department for their quick response to the church fire.

Enterprise & Community Engagement – Lynne Chapman

Lynne Chapman reported for the month of March the Water and Sewer Department completed 180 work orders. The meters were read on May 15th. Rechecks were done on the 17th and disconnects were done March 28th. 40 customers were disconnected for non-payment and 32 of these reconnected. The Sanitation Department, both residential and commercial, operated on normal schedules for the month of May.

Recreation – Ken Dill

Ken Dill reported the new security fence is in place around the Community Park Playground thanks to a grant from the State Parks and Recreation program. He said both playgrounds have received new play safe mulch.

Ken Dill reported the recreation staff has converted the 10 parking spaces along the fence of Bolick Field in the parking lot to handicap parking to address the number of concerns about lack of Handicap parking for ballgames.

Ken Dill reported we will be co-hosting the 8u District Diamond Baseball Tournament June 13-16 at Nettles Park. He thanked Robert Griffin for arranging for Atlanta Braves Hall of Famer Leo David Mazzone to be in attendance Saturday at 930am at Geer Field at Nettles Park and he will address players and fans and then be available for a period doing autographs and pictures.

Ken Dill thanked De'Andre Hopkins for the funds to purchase new helmets for our youth.

Finance and Marketing – Curtis Peek

Curtis Peek reported our general fund currently has a balance of \$794,502.07. This is an increase of \$70,133.11. This is an increase of 9.23% in the general fund from April to May.

Curtis Peek reported our Enterprise funds have the following revenues for the month of February and year to date balances. The water budget for May has a surplus of \$22,667 and for the year we currently have a deficit of \$24,627. This is a decrease of 63.03% in our deficit from April to May. The sewer budget for May has a deficit of \$52,280 and year to date the sewer account has a surplus of \$98,444. This is a decrease of 41.96% in the sewer fund from April to May. The sanitation budget for April has a surplus of\$ 10,975 and year to date sanitation account has a surplus of\$ 70,692. This is an increase of 16.83% in the sanitation fund from April to May.

<u>Tourism and Economic Development – Robert Griffin</u>

Robert Griffin reported the Farmers Market will continue each Saturday from 9am-12 noon until July 16 when the heat becomes extreme.

Robert Griffin reported the new Garden Club will hold its first meeting on Tuesday, June 25th, 6pm at the Collaboration Station. They will utilize some of the planters that were purchased for the downtown area and are being re-purposed.

Robert Griffin reported the First Friday Concerts at the Depot will resume in September and October as weather cools and permits.

Robert Griffin reported SWU Homecoming will be October 4 and 5. The Main Street program will collaborate on possible ways to partner for the event with SWU.

Robert Griffin reported the Trick or Trains will be Saturday, October 26 from 1-5pm downtown.
